Selected to the Senior Executive Service in July 2017, Mr. Paschal serves as the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff, G-3/5/7 and the Deputy G-37 for Training at Headquarters, U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC), Fort Eustis, Virginia. He is charged with managing and transforming the Army's training base, affecting more than a half million military in over 32 Army schools and training centers. In this capacity, he also manages several major programs including all Army security assistance training, inter-service, and reserve component training. Additionally, he serves as the Army's Functional Chief's Representative for over 6,500 Training, Capability, and Doctrine Warfighting Developers serving in Career Program 32.

Previously, Mr. Paschal served as the Deputy Director and Director at the G-27 Operational Environment Training Support Center (OE TSC) at Fort Eustis, Virginia. Developed by TRADOC, the OE TSC is the Army's primary enabler for building, validating, creating, maintaining, and delivering the context of the Operational Environment (OE) for leader development, training and education, capability design, and concept development efforts.

Mr. Paschal retired from the Army as The Chief of Operations Group for the Joint Warfighting Center, U.S. Joint Forces Command in Suffolk, Virginia. He was commissioned an Infantry lieutenant upon completion of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps program at the University of Illinois at Chicago in 1984. He has served in a variety of operational assignments culminating with command of the Warrior Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division, which included a 14-month tour in Kirkuk, Iraq. He is a graduate of the Army's War College at Carlisle Barracks.

Mr. Paschal was born and raised in Chicago, Illinois and is married with two grown children. His oldest daughter is a Special Education teacher and his son serves as a Boatswain's Mate in The United States Coast Guard.
